Belize is an English-speaking country, only two hours from the US. It is located on the Caribbean Sea with friendly people and a stable government. Belize has much to offer as a third world country, including over seven languages (Mayan Mopan, Mayan Kekchi, Garifuna, Spanish, Creole, German, and various oriental languages) as well as many Maya ruins. There's a lot to choose from: the beautiful Caribbean Sea to the rugged Maya Mountains, rivers, wildlife, and Maya villages.

Group Service Projects

- 1. Church Support** – VBS, pastors' conferences, evangelism, discipleship.
- 2. Teaching in Schools** – Reading, math and computer training is a big need.
- 3. Construction** – Projects include helping to build an orphanage, Christian radio station, repairing and painting churches, schools, and homes for the elderly and poor.
- 4. Sports** – Coach and play local Belizean teams (soccer, basketball and softball).
- 5. Medical Teams** – Help with all kinds of medical needs. Medical students can work with Belize physicians and nurses in local clinics and hospitals with on-hand training—some students are getting college credit.
- 6. Drama** – Teach and perform at our theater at the Embassy Hotel and at local schools, churches, homes for the elderly, and prisons.
- 7. Music** – Perform, conduct, and teach in all musical areas from choirs to piano and guitar. Schools and churches are in great need of musical training and volunteers sharing their talents (they are deeply appreciated)

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES IN BELIZE

Academic Credit Offered to Students for Studies in Belize

Through our new 24-day international study program in Belize, colleges and high schools will be able to offer academic credit to their students for a life-changing experience. Students will study first-hand many different ethnic groups, living and working with the people in their own homes and villages. The education institution will send their own instructors, determine the grades and credit while we provide the experiences and take care of their housing, food and transportation needs. We work with the school and its professors to customize the experiences according to the desires of the institution.

A Basic Outline

1. **ONE WEEK IN CENTRAL AND NORTHERN BELIZE.** Students will experience the commercial center of the country as they live and work outside Belize City while staying at the high security Embassy Mission House. This is a forty-room hotel at the Belize International Airport with kitchen and dining facilities, and a movie theater that seats 200 people. Traveling to the north, students will visit Spanish, Creole, and Mennonite communities, studying the culture and customs, and spending one night in a Mennonite community.

2. **ONE WEEK ON SAN PEDRO, AMBERGRIS CAYE (ISLAND).** Students will work with schools, sports, clinics, and low-cost housing. They will also be able to fish, and to swim and snorkel at the largest living reef in the world.

3. **ONE WEEK IN SOUTHERN BELIZE NEAR THE RAINFOREST.** Students will study the Mayan and Garifuna cultures, working side-by-side with people who are eager to learn but also eager to teach their local customs. Experiences include a trip to the jungle and rainforest, and spending a day in a Mayan village working in the schools, playing soccer and eating with the people (corn is fixed in over a hundred ways from corn coffee to corn tortillas).
